Present: Chair Yoder, Vice-Chair Moore, Commissioner Beiler, Commissioner Hargett, Commissioner Melton.

Also present were County Manager Pittman, County Attorney Berg, Clerk to the Board Freeman, media, and citizens.

1. Public Hearing

Chair Yoder called to order the Public Hearing for the adoption of the Regional Water Authority Resolution.

- A. Call to Order the Public Hearing - The purpose of the Public Hearing is to receive public comment on the proposed resolution to be adopted by the Board of Commissioners signifying the organization of the Polk County Regional Water Authority. The Public Hearing was properly advertised in the Tryon Daily Bulletin.

Attorney Belton Zeigler presented information regarding the Regional Water Authority Resolution.

The team presented medallions, designed to resemble the championship rings, to the Commissioners, Manager Pittman, and Attorney Berg. A group photo was taken with the volleyball team and Commissioners, followed by applause from the attendees of the Board of Commissioners meeting.

† J. Emergency Management Update

Bobby Arledge, Emergency Management Director and Fire Marshal, announced that the Army Corps of Engineers has cleared 92,205 cubic yards of right-of-way debris. The right-of-way debris removal will end on Monday, March 31. FEMA's Private Property Debris Removal (PPDR) program has received 184 applications, with 68 properties already assessed. Applications are still being received at www.PolkNC.gov/PPDR and citizens are encouraged to apply. Mr. Arledge presented before and after pictures of Hurricane Helene damage to show how much progress has been made throughout the county. Mr. Arledge also expressed his gratitude to all Emergency Services workers in the county for their dedication and hard work, both during the hurricane and the recent 3910 fire, which burned a total of 619 acres.

Chair Yoder has nominated Mr. Arledge for the Heroic Hands award, which recognizes individuals who demonstrate exceptional dedication and integrity in serving their county. Mr. Arledge will be featured in a book across the state highlighting nominees from all 100 counties in the state.

13. Commissioner Comments.

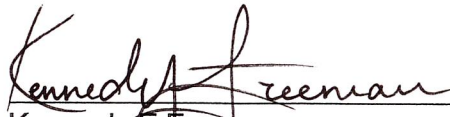

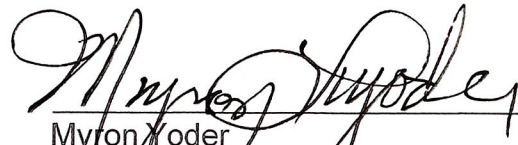
